For The Birds

I'll have to apologize to one of my brother's in law. He called to tell me about a bird he was watching that looked like a Baltimore oriel – only yellow. Even female Baltimore Orioles have enough orange to notice. Sometimes the juveniles look pretty yellow when they're old enough to be seen out and about but are noticeably fuzzy still and I think it's still a little early for that. So I told him to look up the Orchard Oriole – which he did – and the pictures of the Orchard females looked like the item to him. In retrospect, I should also have mentioned the possibility of Bullock's Oriole. I seldom think of the Bullocks because their range is so much further west. However, my brother in law lives in Iowa – still east of the Bullock range proper – but close enough that one might show up occasionally. I should also probably allow in my thinking about Juveniles that Spring is more advanced in Iowa than North-East Ohio. It's a common mistake in our thinking – and not just about birds – to imagine that local conditions prevail everywhere. The more we travel the more we realize how different things can be elsewhere. Of course, our human version of the 'snow-birds' figured that out a long time ago which is why the population of Sr. citizens in Florida increases so dramatically December through March!

Wandering farther from the actual bird in the lead paragraph in this column than I usually do, we are often pretty hard on the church. Admittedly the church has flaws and sometimes they are noticeable and troubling! And my particular life experience left me pretty slow to realize the difference between conditions in the church and – elsewhere. In the tiny town I grew up in the congregation I attended was fairly broadly infused into the community. Further, I took off right after graduation to attend Bible College and Seminary and have worked in the church all my adult life. My closest friends and contacts have always been – churched. Others of my childhood friends experienced 'the world' much sooner and more intensely than I. Some of them didn't survive the experience. Some of those who survived are badly scarred. Some, were ultimately driven right back into the arms of the church and seem, to me, much happier for it. Though I have been in the church all my life, I have, over the years got to see enough of the world to draw a couple of conclusions. 1. The conditions experienced in the church do not prevail in the world. 2. The conditions that prevail in the church are (human flaws and all) much preferable. *Behold, how good and how pleasant....*

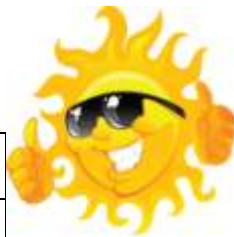
